Model It on the AAC Device



Modeling on your child's device is just "talking" using his/her language! When you say a word with your voice, also say it using your child's device. Look up the words that you are going model using WORD FINDER before you start playing. Start with one word and then add 1-2 words.

Tips to Engage, Expand, and Succeed:

Depending on your child/client and the recipe, it might be safest to use a low-tech board to keep the AAC device protected from liquids or other accidents while cooking. You can download low-tech boards here:

- There is a lot of language that occurs while cooking and baking! And there are many things you can focus on, such as:
 - o Following directions: one step, two step, etc.
 - o Concepts: in/out, a little/a lot, big/little, wet/dry, some, a few, etc.
 - o Time/Ordinal Directions: first, next, then, last, etc.
 - o Functional Tasks: numbers, measuring, etc.
- Cooking is a natural activity, so remember to keep your modeling and language natural. Try to avoid making the task all about requesting items or asking for more.
 - o Instead, try using parallel talk. Talk about what you are doing. Share information on what needs to be done next.
 - Don't anticipate the AAC user's needs. Let them try and wait until they ask for help!




Attached to a one-page communication board
